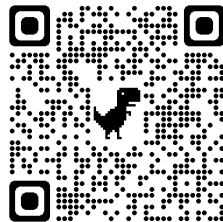

Covid 19 Protocols

Please be advised that the organizing committee and Sea to Sky Nordics will be following all Provincial Health orders relating to Covid-19 protocols. Current PHO Orders require all coaches, volunteers and other adult participants to have double vaccinations in order to participate in youth sport.

In addition, BC Cup 1 has a **mandatory double vaccination policy** for all participants (athletes, coaches, volunteers, officials). All participants who are eligible to be vaccinated must provide proof of vaccination upon arrival. Failure to produce your vaccine passport and government ID will forfeit your participation in the event and you will be asked to leave the event. No refunds for athletes will be provided for failure to provide your vaccine passport. Current provincial health orders require all volunteers, coaches and officials to be vaccinated, so we will be requiring proof before entry to the race venue.

1. General Information

Competition Venue

Whistler Olympic Park hosted the Nordic events for the 2010 Winter Olympic Games. The biathlon stadium features 30 electronic HoRa targets, with covered canopy and lights. The trails are open with natural snow from mid-November until mid-April. There are fourteen on-trail wax cabins within 100 metres of the range. The range is at 870 metres elevation. The highest point on course is at 890m elevation and the lowest point is at 849m elevation.

Whistler Olympic Park is located 16km south of Whistler and 40km north of Squamish on Highway 99, then 9km West on Callaghan Valley Road.

Rifle Import Regulations

Teams and individual competitors from outside of Canada must declare their rifles at the Canadian border, complete the necessary documentation, and pay the required fees when bringing rifles and ammunition into Canada. All athletes must register their own rifles and pay the applicable fee. Refer to the [RCMP Firearms Program](#) to obtain a Non-Resident Firearms Declaration.

Rules

International Biathlon Union (IBU) rules and regulations shall apply as fully as possible to all classes. Specific rules for classes not covered in IBU rules contained in the current hosting policies of Biathlon Canada and Biathlon BC shall apply to those classes.

Eligibility to Enter

All competitors must be registered participants with Biathlon BC or an equivalent Provincial or State organization to enter.

Biathlon BC members in good standing are eligible to receive full benefit of results in Biathlon BC programs, such as BC Cup points, team or squad selections. Any member of Biathlon Canada or other IBU Nations in good standing may enter, but will not be eligible for Biathlon BC programs and awards.

Training

The range will be open for official training on December 17 from 11:00-14:30. All athletes must have a trail ticket to participate in the official training session. Athletes can purchase discounted trail passes to Whistler Olympic Park (\$16.50 per adult, 7.90 per youth plus 5% GST) through the Zone4 registration link - [Biathlon BC Cup 1 Registration link](#). Anyone who will be skiing requires a trail pass. Please note that volunteers, officials and coaches are required to register through Zone4, but there is no cost for these tickets. Your name must be on the registration list for entry. We encourage parents and spectators to purchase tickets online ahead of time to speed up the gate entry process if you are not attending the event in an official/volunteer/coach capacity.

2. Competition Information

Entry Fees

\$40 per athlete (\$35 for Novice/Juvenile), per competition. Trail passes for competitions and zone4 processing fees are included with the entry fee.

Dinner/social banquet tickets are \$25 per person which includes dinner, dessert and a non-alcoholic drink. Tickets can be added to your registration on Zone4. In order to plan for numbers, all tickets to the banquet must be purchased no later than December 10, 2021. Alcoholic drinks will be available for purchase at the banquet.

Lunch tickets will also be available for purchase through Zone4 for Saturday and Sunday. Lunch will be provided to all volunteers and officials on Saturday and Sunday - another great reason to volunteer! Athletes, coaches and other participants may purchase lunch tickets for \$8.00. Given the distance from the biathlon range to the day lodge and a cross country Coast Cup on the same weekend, we recommend either purchasing lunch, or bringing your own. Limited tickets will be available on the days of competition.

Registration

All individuals who wish to attend, including athletes, coaches, and team support personnel must register in advance. Finalized registrations are due by December 3, 2021 at 23:59 through [Biathlon BC Cup 1 Registration Link](#). No entries will be accepted after this time.

Entries will be confirmed on December 17, 2021 at the Team Captains Meeting.

Cancellation Policy

If an athlete withdraws before December 10, 2021, a \$15 processing fee will apply before a refund is sent. No refunds will be given after this date.

Classes of Competition

The following classes of competition will be run, depending on sufficient entries. Classes with fewer than three registrants may be combined with another class. Age is as of December 31, 2021. An athlete who is 16 may elect to compete in either the Senior Boys/Senior Girls or Youth Men/Women category. This selection must be made when registering and cannot be changed. Competitors in the Masters and Sport categories must carry their rifles.

Sea to Sky Nordics are planning to host unofficial races for the non-BC Cup classes in the afternoons on Saturday and Sunday. These races will be limited to one 30 person wave and are dependent on weather etc. If for some reason we cannot run these categories, we will refund the entry fees. The race organisers do not recommend travelling to this event for the sole purpose of competing in the Novice or Juvenile categories for this reason.

Senior Boy/Girl categories

Teams will be responsible for transporting their own athletes' rifles during the Senior Boy/Girl categories.

Team Captains Meeting

The Team Captains Meeting will be held at the Whistler Athletes Centre, HUB Room, 1080 Legacy Way, Whistler, BC V8E 0K3 on Dec 17, 2021 at 19:00.

Awards

For the BC Cup Classes, medals for first three places will be awarded in classes with four or more competitors along with podium recognition for 4th, 5th and 6th place; in classes with three competitors, medals will be awarded for first and second place; in classes with two competitors, medals will be awarded for first place; and in classes with one competitor there will be podium recognition only.

Novice and Juvenile categories will be awarded participant medals, along with recognition of the first 6 places.

The awards for the Saturday competitions will be awarded at the banquet/social event. This will be a dinner and social event at Myrtle Philip Community School at 5:30 pm located at 6195 Lorimer Rd, Whistler, BC V8E 0C5. Dinner, drinks and games will be available. Tickets are \$25 per person. Alcoholic drinks will be available for purchase.

Wax Policy

The Biathlon BC June 2019 Wax Policy will be in effect. 100% Fluoro, High Fluoro (for example UHF and HF), Medium Fluoro, and similarly fluorinated glide waxes, powders, pucks, blocks, liquids and other applications are not permitted. Only Low Fluoro (for example LF and LF Race) and non-Fluorinated glide waxes, powders, pucks, blocks, liquids and other applications are permitted. The use of hand structure on skis is permitted.

3. Logistical Information

Accommodation

Teams are responsible for arranging their own accommodation during the event. The organizing committee has negotiated discounted rates in Squamish and Whistler.

Wax Cabins

Whistler Olympic Park has 13 wax cabins at the biathlon range stadium. For Covid-19 reasons, the public flex spaces will not be available for the athletes, coaches or other participants. For this reason, we highly recommend that each team request a wax cabin. This can be your headquarters for the race, keep you warm, wax your skis etc. The cabins are

heated and have electricity. They have a table and chairs. The cost is \$80 for the entire event. Sea to Sky Nordics have applied for an event hosting grant. If we are successful and receive the grant, we will reimburse teams for this expense.

The rental fee, along with a \$100 refundable key deposit can be paid directly by e-transfer to paulinelysaght1@gmail.com. Keys will be available at the race office on Thursday/Friday or at the Captain's Meeting on Friday.
